

Dismissal Procedure (School Bus)


- P1 students line up in the hall according to their school bus number.
- P1 students will board school buses first.

- Parents/ caregivers enter the school via Gate 4.
- Wait at the waiting area
- If parents/ caregivers are late for more than 15 minutes, your child/ward will be brought to the Guard House.



#### P1 First Day of School 2 Jan 2026 Friday


- Only P1 students report to school.

#### Name Tag (Lanyard)

- To be worn at all times until end of January
- Indicate contact number
- Indicate <u>school bus number</u> (not bus plate number) or '<u>PT</u>' (private/public transport)



# Students' Attire (refer to BT kit for details of school rules)

#### **UNIFORM**

 P1 students may wear PE attire from the start of the day if they have PE/PAL (Outdoor Education, Games & Sports, Dance) lessons.

Hair (for girls)	<ul> <li>Long hair to be tied</li> <li>Black or dark blue ribbons, hairclips /hairbands</li> </ul>
Accessories	<ul><li>Small pair of ear studs for girls</li><li>Other jewellery is not allowed</li></ul>
Shoes & Socks	<ul><li>Plain white school shoes</li><li>White socks</li></ul>
Bag	<ul> <li>Trolley bags are discouraged</li> <li>Cubbies are provided in classrooms for personal belongings.</li> </ul>

#### BTPS new School Uniform

- The new uniform includes one common top for all weekdays.
- Students can wear shorts on days that has PE and/or PAL lessons.
- Students are to wear uniform top with formal bottoms on days without PE or PAL lessons.



#### **Absence from School**

Valid Reasons for Absence	Examples
Absent with MC	<ul><li>Medical leave</li><li>Hospitalisation leave</li></ul>
Absent with Valid Reason (VR)  – Up to five occasions in one semester.	<ul> <li>Medical</li> <li>Bereavement or serious illness of a family member</li> <li>Personal or family commitments</li> <li>Extenuating circumstances</li> <li>The school will assess each application on a case-by-case basis. Parents/Guardians are advised to write in via email to your child/ward's Form Teacher in advance where possible.</li> <li>Note: Family holidays during school days are not considered as valid reason.</li> </ul>

- To be kept in bag at all times
- For worksheets and other handouts
- Teach your child to pack it daily

All belongings including water bottle and lunchbox

- To be labelled clearly with name and class
- Form teachers will direct students to school Lost and Found corner (Shelf outside School Library)
