Why introduce Subject-Based Banding?

Introduced by MOE in 2019

- Every child is unique and has different aptitudes, capabilities and talents.
- ▶ To recognise the different abilities of students
 - Provide more flexibility in subject combinations for students across subjects

What Subject-Based Banding means for your child?

- Greater flexibility in subject combinations
- Your child has the choice to take a combination of standard and foundation subjects, depending on his strengths
- Build up their understanding in subjects they need more help with.

What are the choices available?

[At P4]

How does Subject-Based Banding Work? School recommends subject combination, based on P4 exam results. Parents indicate preferred combination in an option form (via PG).

[At P5]

Student takes subject combination chosen by parents.

School assesses your child's ability to cope with the subjects at the end of the year.

[End of P5]

What happens at the end of P5?

Student who takes standard subjects and has difficulty coping	All other students
School may allow him to take 1 or more subjects at foundation level in P6	School will allow them to continue the same subject combination in P6



[At P6]

Student takes subject combination decided by school



[End of P6]

Student sits for Primary School Leaving Examination (PSLE)

Subjectbased Banding and Secondary School admission

- Progression to secondary level depends on the Revised PSLE Scoring System.
 - Different expectations of standard and foundation subjects will be taken into account
- Offering subjects at foundation level is not a disadvantage.
 - Your child will be able to focus on building up strong fundamentals

Revised PSLE Scoring System:

Achievement Levels (ALs)

- The PSLE T-Score has been replaced with wider scoring bands, known as Achievement Levels (ALs).
- Each PSLE subject will be scored using 8 ALs. Students who perform similarly will be placed in the same AL for each subject.

1	≥ 90	
2	85 - 89	
3	80 - 84	
4	75 - 79	
5	65 - 74	
6	45 - 64	
7	20 - 44	
8	< 20	

Revised PSLE Scoring System: Scoring for Foundation Level Subjects

- ► Foundation subject grades are graded in scoring bands from AL A to AL C.
- ► To derive a student's overall PSLE score, AL A to AL C for Foundation level subjects are mapped to AL 6 to AL 8 of Standard level subjects respectively

Grades for Foundation	Foundation Raw Mark Range	Equivalent Standard Level AL
Α	75 - 100	6
В	30 -74	7
С	< 30	8

Exploring the subject combinations available




Band 1	85 marks and above	Is very good in the subject
Band 2	70 - 84 marks	Is good in the subject
Band 3	50 - 69 marks	Has adequate grasp of the subject
Band 4	Below 50 marks	Has elementary grasp of the subject

At PSLE, Students who obtained Distinction/Merit/Pass in HCL and a PSLE Score of 14 or better (i.e. PSLE Score ≤ 14) at PSLE will be eligible for posting advantage to 11 SAP schools.



Semestral Assessment Parent to seek input from Subject Teachers



Issuance of SBB Option Form (12 Nov 2025) Parent to respond to SBB Option Form via Parents Gateway (by 17 Nov 2025, 12 noon) Be open and flexible when discussing your child's preferences, needs and choices. Manage your own expectations and do not project these expectations onto your child.

Have regular conversations with your child to understand more about his/her interests and aspirations.



Affirm your child and offer support when he/she shares his/her plans with you.

Questions posed via Parents Gateway

- 1. What is the impact of selecting a certain kind of banding subject on secondary school?
- 2. Is there an intentional split/allocation of students with differing aptitudes in the same class?
- 3. How are teaching methods adjusted to different bands?
- 4. For kids who are borderline pass/fail, what's the recommended approach?

- 5. Will the recommendations be based only on year end exam or the entire P4 examination?
- 6. SBB means my kid will be in a class based on the performance of the Subject in exams? In P5, will they be getting any extra support from teachers in the subject he is weaker in?
- 7. My child requires learning support How will SBB affect him?
